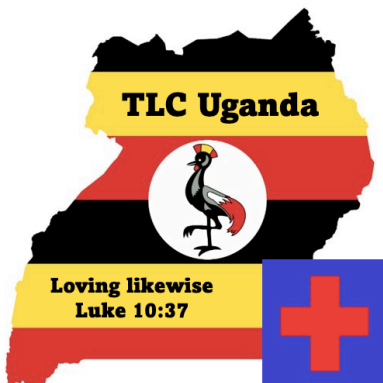
Our mission is to be of maximum service to God and His children in Uganda, to heal, protect, and nurture abundant life, and to restore relationship with God through Jesus Christ.

The granddaddy of our plans is a medical clinic, with separate dormitory-style wards for men and women, open not just for the sick but those displaced by or at risk for violence.

- Malaria, HIV, and TB still kill thousands, though they are treatable if identified.
- 44% of Ugandan women suffer a physical injury as a result of gender-based violence every year.
- Political unrest and war still ravage Uganda's neighbors to the north and west, the refugees from which often travel Gulu-Kampala Road.



Officially incorporated

After seven long years, TLC Uganda is finally incorporated, though there is still work to be done to achieve official tax-exempt status as a 501(c)3 non-profit. We have secured a residence in Uganda!

We were able to rent a two-bedroom apartment with indoor plumbing on the southern outskirts of Gulu, a major city in the north of Uganda. The unit is one of six in the brand-new complex, and is secured in a walled compound, with a large, steel gate and a live-on security officer. On his last trip, Todd was able to obtain basic furniture and kitchen necessities, but we look forward to Cindy's arrival to make this a real home. Todd managed to get a group of his friends (pictured below) to help give the place a good scrubbing. A contractor has assessed the home for the application of a solar power system which will be added early 2022. Folks are already calling this "Mucungua Manor." For the time being, Cindy will still maintain the American home, though downsized to a small condo across from their home church, in order to tend to the needs of her aging parents (see Mark 7:9-13). From there, she will assist in the administration of the mission, its organization, and correspondence.
