Returning to Uganda

After a three-month itinerate tour and furlough in the States, Todd and Cindy Lemmon are packing their bags again, preparing to head back to Uganda in mid-July. Until it becomes home, their length of stay is limited by tourist visa rules. We hope this trip holds the key to getting things started with buying the land on which the mission structures will eventually go. One obstacle has been that Ugandan land can only be permanently purchased by Ugandans. The American option is a lease that, after 99 years, returns to the tribe it came from. Our vision is to build something that outlasts these



generations. It is not about us, but about what an eternal God can do when we submit to Him. So we will form a Uganda Limited Corporation, built with TLCU team members, that can do what individual Americans cannot.

Our sponsored students, who are the future of this mission, two of whom just obtained their diplomas but who must find a way to make do until we can employ them for mission purpose;


Our Luo language teacher and her husband, Beatrice and Simon, who just survived a miscarriage;

Tax exempt status application meets obstacle

We submitted our 501(c)(3) application to the IRS so that we can apply for corporate sponsorship, receive grants, and process your gifts without a middle-man. Being tax exempt will mean a lot more dollars being turned into lives saved and changed. Last week we got the



disappointing news that our application was declined over a technicality, and we have resubmitted it according to their guidelines. While we wait, we continue to utilize a missionary servicing agency for our support donations.

We launched in faith two years ago even before securing full funding. When in the USA, Todd and Cindy work hard to develop



relationships with churches, businesses, fellowship groups, and individuals.
