


Cindy is Cancer Free!

New Developments and Improvements

Aside from the perimeter enclosure, we also had to upgrade a few things to make our property functional. First, the latrine, a \$4,000 project sorely needed, since the traditional one on the property was falling down and filling up. Yuk! Our herd of goats and sheep needed a home, so we built a wooden structure for them, along with a couple chicken houses. Our livestock keeps multiplying. Today, we have eleven goats, three sheep, and about forty chickens. We feed our team with the livestock and produce of the land. Beans and peanuts are staples.

In our last issue, we disclosed that our landlady needed to do some renovations, but needed us out to do it. There was some difficulty on that topic, so we loaded up our trike-truck (“tuk-tuk”) and moved closer to town. The good news is we have much more consistent power, and we had bunk beds made for the guest room, so you are welcome to visit. There is also a selection of hotels nearby, for those less adventurous.



We finally received our Freehold Land Title!
